

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**  
**Binding Borders Around The World Quilt Show Rules**  
**Presented by Coastal Prairie Quilt Guild of Texas**  
**September 10-11, 2010**

Definitions:

**Exhibitor** - The person whose name appears on the entry form. This person could be the top maker OR the quilter in the case of a two person quilt.

**Master** - If either the maker or the quilter of this quilt

- has sold your work or patterns
- has taught quilting
- has won two or more Blue Ribbons in local or national shows in the past 5 years
- has been juried into two or more national shows
- is professional (i.e. works for hire)

**Artisan** - You have not yet done any of the above

**Open** - Both Master and Artisan are judged together

**Non-Judged** - Quilts are hung in the show but not judged

**Art Quilts** - Any quilt that includes a significant amount of non-traditional techniques such as pictorial painting, beading, thread work, dimensional work or other embellishment that is a major design element

**Wearable** - The piece must be intended to be worn as a garment.

**Three Dimensional and Dolls** - Any three-dimensional fabric work.

**Youth** - 17yrs. and under

**Virtual** - Any quilt designed using computer software and constructed using that design.

**Open Category:** (If quilt fits in any of these categories, go no further)

101 - Non-Judged/Display only-Any quilt that the entrant does not want to be judged. Any number of "makers" can be involved. These quilts can use any technique and can be any size.

102 - Show Theme or Challenge Quilts

103- Miniature Quilts: One or Two person quilts (quilts made by 3 or more persons regardless of size must go in the Group Quilt category) with no side measuring more than 24". Any technique can be used, and it may be hand or machine quilted. The scale of design should be miniature as well.

104 - Group Quilts: Three or more person quilts in any size using any technique for construction and quilting

105 - Other: Wholecloth, Crazy, Yo-Yo, Block of the Month, Kits, Pre-stamped quilts.

106 - Wearable Art: The piece must be intended to be worn as a garment. The piece must be either pieced, appliquéd, and/or quilted. The quilting technique is the choice of the maker.

107 - Three Dimensional and Dolls (one or more people): Any three-dimensional fabric work, including but not limited to dolls, handbags, ornament etc.

108 - Virtual: Any quilt designed using a computer software program and constructed using that design.

109 - Guild Donation Quilts for 2010 or 2011: (no charge for entry) Guild can display information about the guild and/or quilt but may not sell tickets for the quilt

109A - Judged

109B - Non-Judged/Display only

**Artisan Category:** (See Artisan Definitions)

201 - Hand quilted quilt, one or two person any size or any technique

202 - One Person Wall Quilt Pieced or Appliquéd: A quilt specifically made to display on a wall with no sides larger than 72". May be pieced, appliquéd or a combination of techniques. Machine quilted.

203 - One Person Large Pieced Quilt: A quilt that is larger than 72" on any one side and is primarily patchwork and machine quilted.

204 - One Person Large Appliquéd Quilt: A quilt larger than 72" on any one side and is primarily appliquéd and machine quilted.

205 - Two Person Wall Quilt Pieced or Appliquéd: A quilt specifically made to display on a wall with no side larger than 72" in which two people were involved in the making and may be pieced, appliquéd or a combination of techniques. Machine quilted.

206 - Two Person Large Pieced or Appliquéd Quilt: A quilt that is larger than 72" on any one side and in which two people were involved in the making. May be pieced, appliquéd or a combination of techniques and machine quilted.

207 - One or Two Person Art Quilt: A quilt using any technique or material in a non-traditional way.

208 - One Person First Show Quilt: The first quilt entered in a judged show by the maker.

209 - Youth Quilt - 17 and under: Any quilt where the maker is 17 yrs of age and under. May quilted or tied.

**Master Category:**

301 - Hand quilted quilt, one or two person any size or any technique

- 302 - One person Wall Quilt Pieced or Appliquéd: A quilt specifically made to display on a wall with no side larger than 72". Machine quilted.
- 303 - One person Large Pieced Quilt: A quilt that is larger than 72" on any one side is primarily patchwork. Machine quilted.
- 304 - One person Large Appliqué Quilt: A quilt that is larger than 72" on any one side and is primarily appliqué. Machine quilted.
- 305 - Two Person Wall Pieced or Appliquéd Quilt: A quilt specifically made to display on a wall with no side larger than 72", in which two people were involved in the making. May be either pieced, appliquéd or a combination of techniques. Machine quilted.
- 306 - Two Person Large Pieced or Appliquéd Quilt: A quilt that is larger than 72" on any one side, and in which two people were involved in the making. May be pieced, appliquéd or a combination of techniques and machine quilted.
- 307 - One or Two Person Art Quilt: A quilt using any technique or material in a non-traditional way.

## Registration

Fee: Members- \$10 per entry (non-refundable);

Non-members - \$15 per entry (non-refundable);

Youth Non-member/Sponsored by Member - \$15 per entry (non-refundable)

Appraisal fee - \$35 per quilt

Fees payable to CPQG of TX

One check will be sufficient for multiple entries.

Items to include:

-Non-returnable color photo (no slides) with name, address, phone number, quilt name, & quilt dimensions on back of photo. The photo must be of the finished quilt and clearly indicate the quilt design and color palette.

-Signed release agreement & filled out for each entry form. Forms must be completely filled out with proper information. Incomplete form will not be accepted.

-Check to cover entry fee and appraisal fee if quilt is to be appraised

- Self-addressed stamped envelope (one envelope will be sufficient for multiple entries).

The SASE will be used to return your receipt after a number has been assigned to your entry. This receipt will be needed to pick up your entry after the show at the designated time.

### **Quilt Preparation**

Quilt should be clean and in good condition. Quilts should be free of animal hair and smoke.

Sleeve: 2" (finished) sleeve on back of Miniature quilts, 4" (finished) sleeve on quilts larger than 24" X 24". **Quilts longer than 86" require a second 4" sleeve 86" from the bottom.**

Label: Exhibitor's name, quilt name, address & phone, sewn in the lower left hand corner looking at the quilt back. If the entry is to be judged, pin a piece of plain fabric over the label to conceal entry information. Entries without labels or sleeves will not be accepted.

### **Show Preparation**

### **Entry Qualifications and Categories**

Tied quilts (except for category 209 - Youth Quilt which may be tied), un-quilted tops will not be accepted. The show committee reserves the right to limit multiple exhibitor entries due to space constraints. Categories are based on the number of quilt makers, construction techniques, size and style. The show committee may reassign, modify or add categories as necessary. If we have more quilt entries than we can accommodate, we will ask you to be selective of your entries.

### **Judging and Awards**

The number and type of ribbons awarded in each category is at the judges' discretion. All quilts except those entered in the non-judged category will receive a judges' critique free of charge.

### **Quilt Appraisal**

A Certified Appraiser will be available to appraise your entry. If you want your quilt appraised, the fee for this service is \$35 per quilt (\$15 will be donated to CPQG of TX).

## **Items available for Purchase**

Items may be identified as "Available for Purchase", must be sold through an agent appointed by CPQG of TX with 20% of the selling price going to CPQG of TX. All checks should be made out to CPQG of TX; funds will be disbursed through the Treasurer. Members are encouraged to place non-judged quilts for sale. Judged quilts, which are sold, will not be taken down early.

Insurance is the responsibility of the owner.
